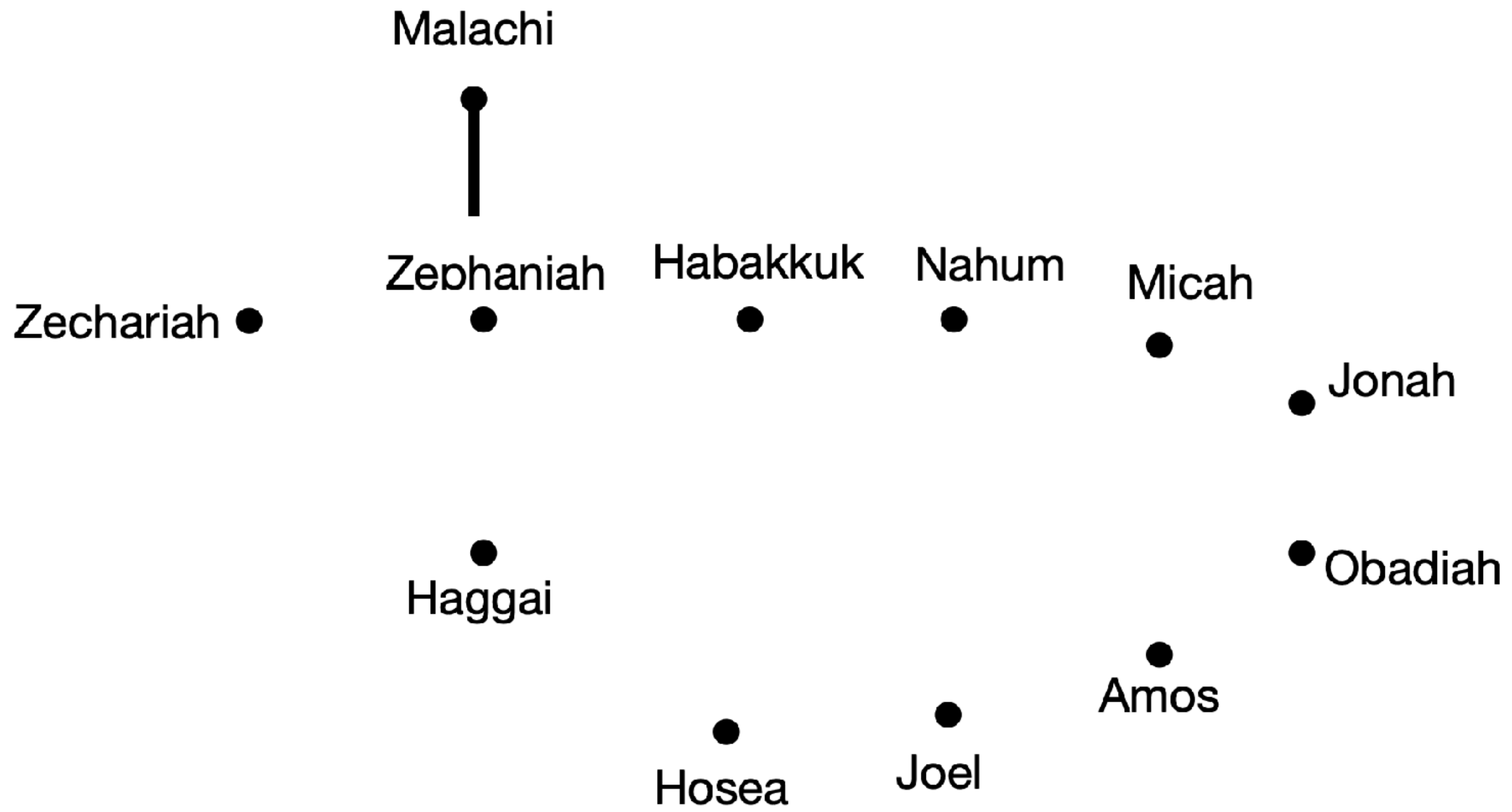












Hosea marries Gomer

“Return”



Hosea 4:1-3 NLT

Hear the word of the LORD, O people of Israel!
The LORD has brought charges against you, saying:
“There is no faithfulness, no kindness,
no knowledge of God in your land.
You make vows and break them;
you kill and steal and commit adultery.
There is violence everywhere—
one murder after another.
That is why your land is in mourning,
and everyone is wasting away.
Even the wild animals, the birds of the sky,
and the fish of the sea are disappearing.

Hosea 6:1-3 NLT

“Come, let us *return* to the LORD.
He has torn us to pieces;
now he will heal us.
He has injured us;
now he will bandage our wounds.
In just a short time he will restore us,
so that we may live in his presence.
Oh, that we might know the LORD!
Let us press on to know him.

Hosea 14:1,4 NLT

Return, O Israel, to the LORD your God,
for your sins have brought you down.
Bring your confessions, and ***return*** to the LORD.
Say to him,
“Forgive all our sins and graciously receive us,
so that we may offer you our praises.

The LORD says,
“Then I will heal you of your faithlessness;
my love will know no bounds,
for my anger will be gone forever.

Now this is what the LORD says to the family of Israel:

“Come back to me and live!

Don't worship at the pagan altars at Bethel;

Dress yourselves in burlap and weep, you priests!

to offer at the Temple of your God.
Announce a time of fasting;
call the people together for a solemn meeting.
Bring the leaders
and all the people of the land
into the Temple of the LORD your God,
and cry out to him there.

Joel 2:12-17 NLT

That is why the LORD says,

“**Turn** to me now, while there is time.

Give me your hearts.

Come with fasting, weeping, and mourning.

Don't tear your clothing in your grief,

but tear your hearts instead.”

Return to the LORD your God,

for he is merciful and compassionate,

slow to get angry and filled with unfailing love.

He is eager to relent and not punish.

Who knows? Perhaps he will give you a reprieve,

sending you a blessing instead of this curse.

Perhaps you will be able to offer grain and wine

to the LORD your God as before.

Blow the ram's horn in Jerusalem!
Announce a time of fasting;
call the people together
for a solemn meeting.
Gather all the people—
the elders, the children, and even the babies.
Call the bridegroom from his quarters
and the bride from her private room.
Let the priests, who minister in the LORD's presence,
stand and weep between the entry room to the Temple and the altar.
Let them pray, "Spare your people, LORD!"

Jonah 3:5-9 NLT

The people of Nineveh believed God's message, and from the greatest to the least, they declared a fast and put on burlap to show their sorrow.

When the king of Nineveh heard what Jonah was saying, he stepped down from his throne and took off his royal robes. He dressed himself in burlap and sat on a heap of ashes. Then the king and his nobles sent this decree throughout the city:

“No one, not even the animals from your herds and flocks, may eat or drink anything at all. People and animals alike must wear garments of mourning, and everyone must pray earnestly to God. They must **turn** from their evil ways and stop all their violence. Who can tell? Perhaps even yet God will change his mind and hold back his fierce anger from destroying us.”

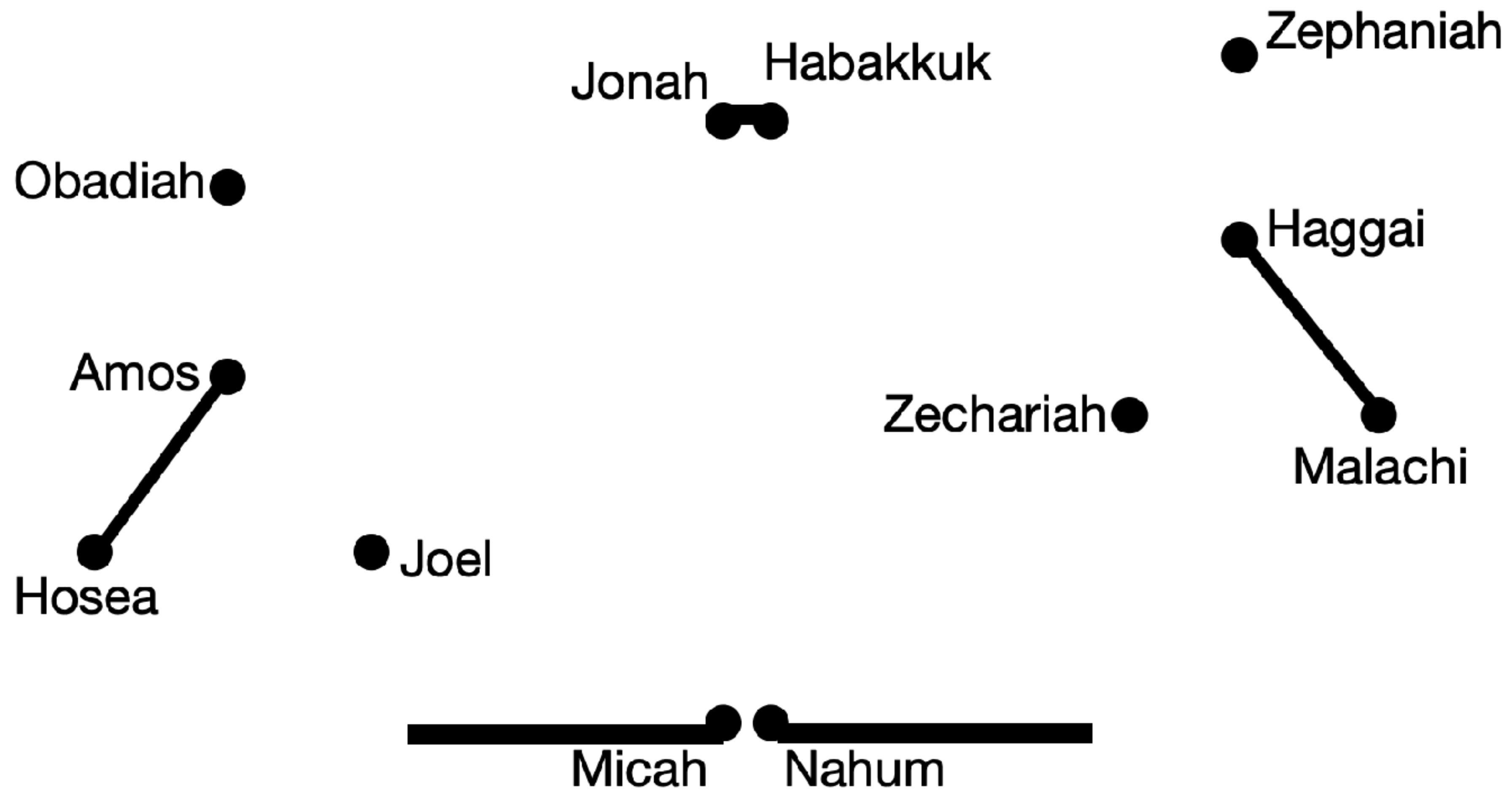

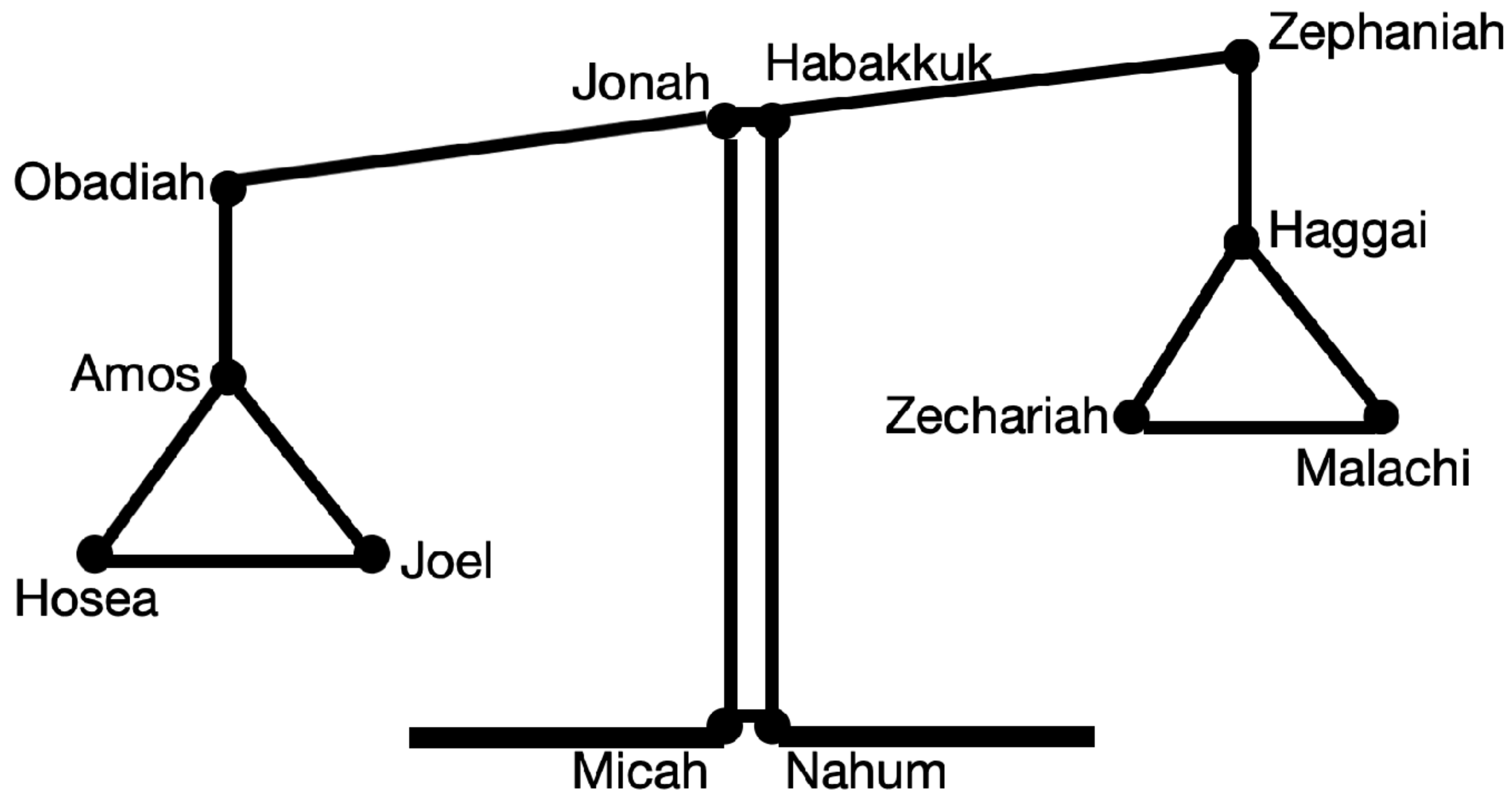

Will you wink at their treachery?

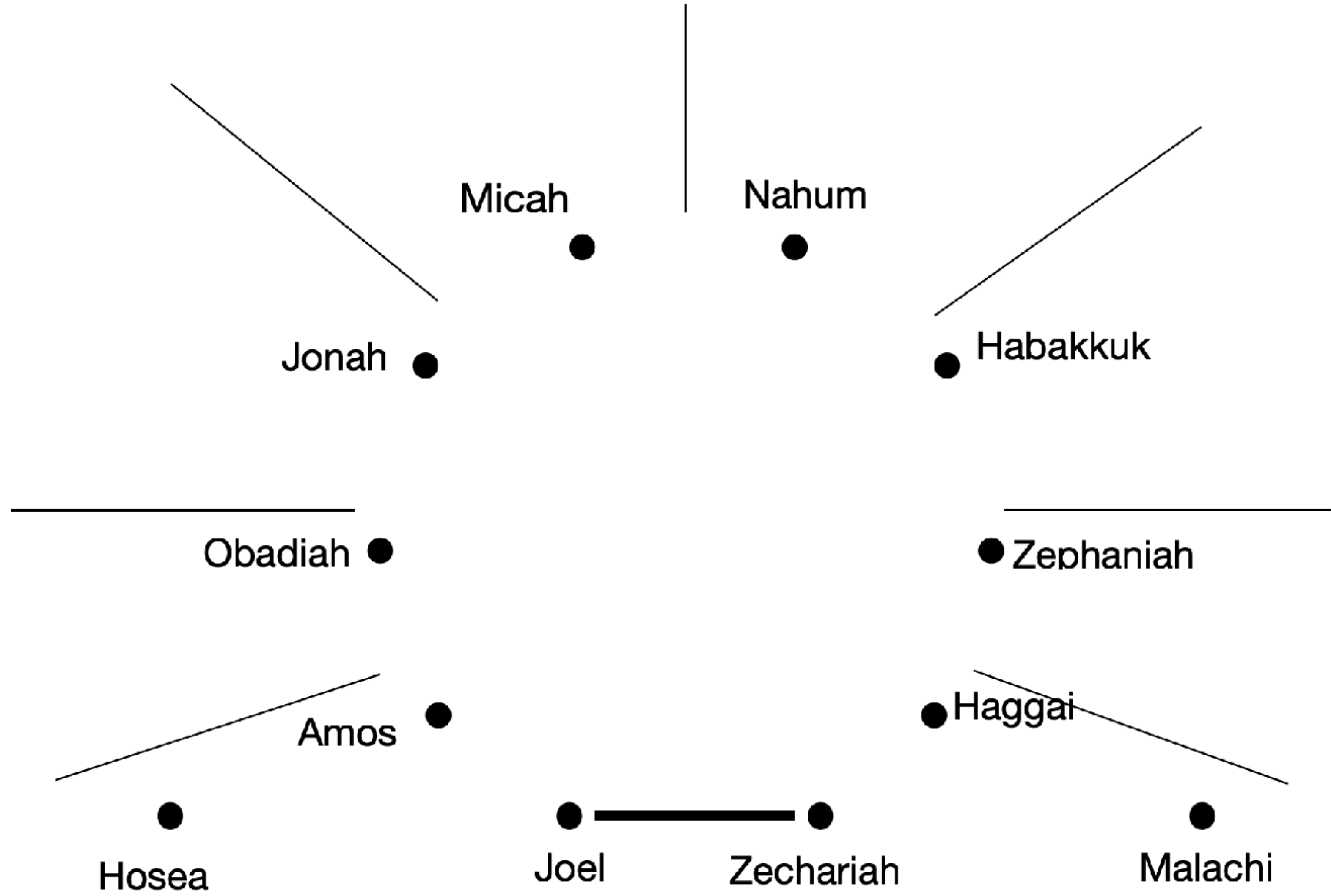

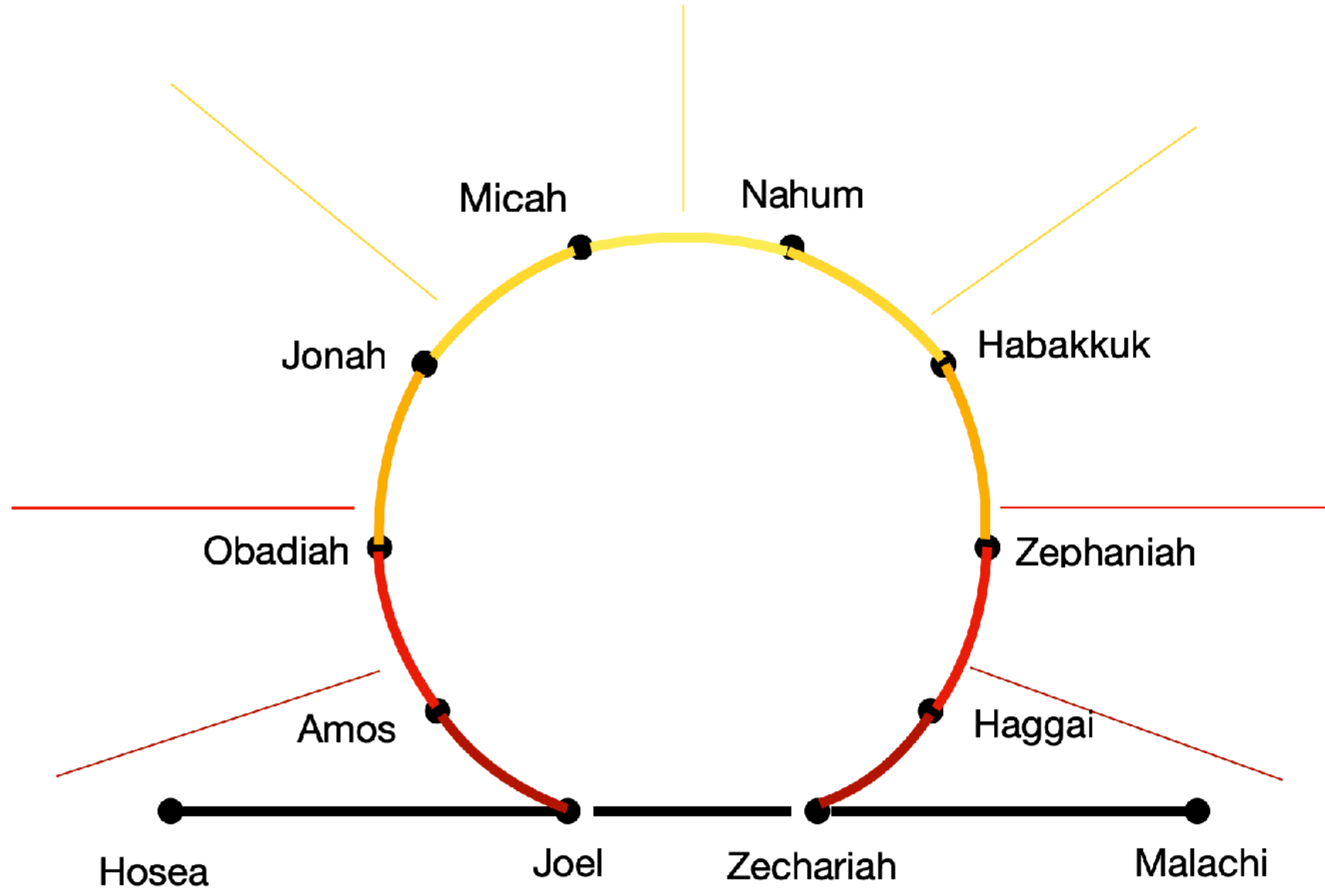

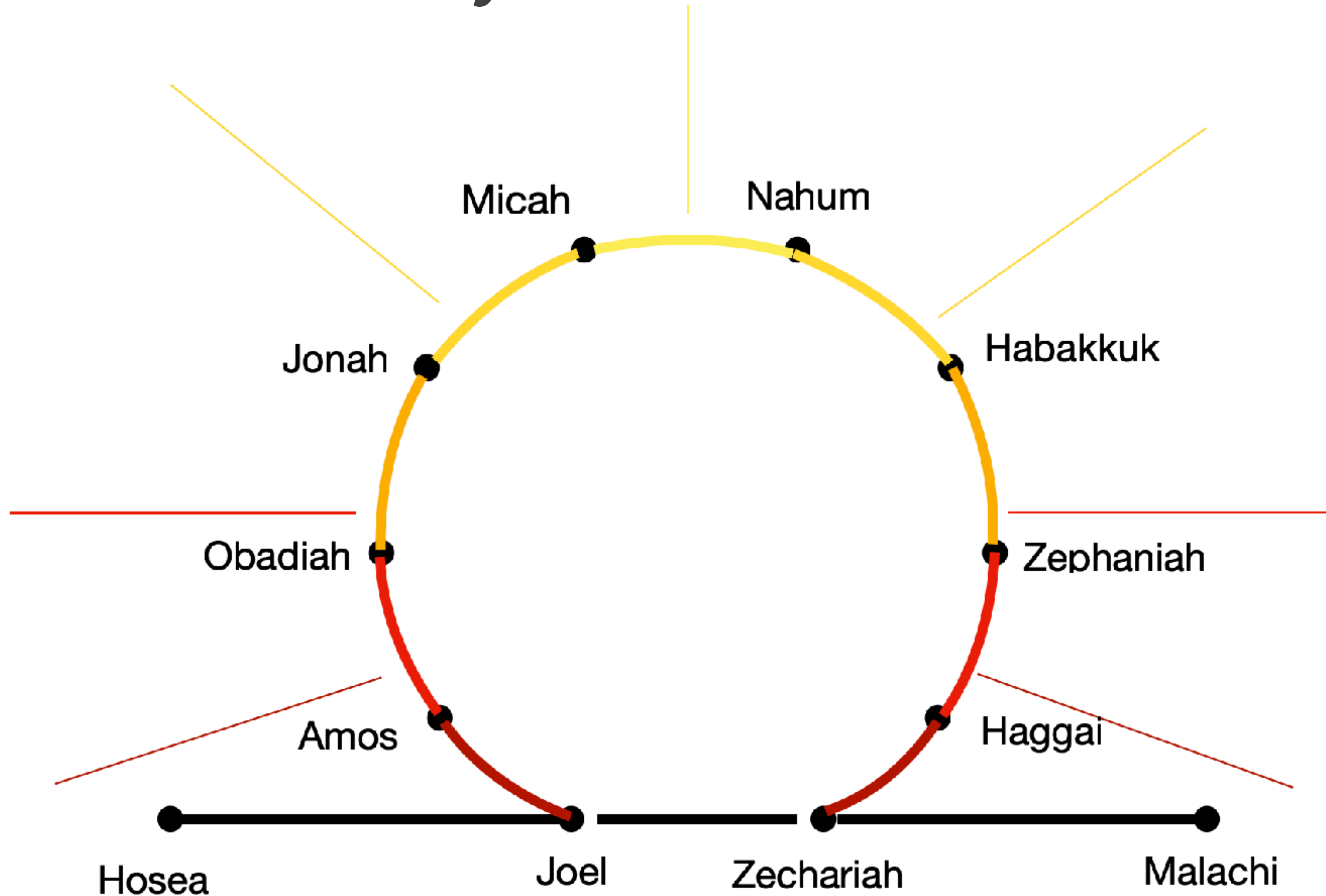
But the righteous will live by their faithfulness to God.

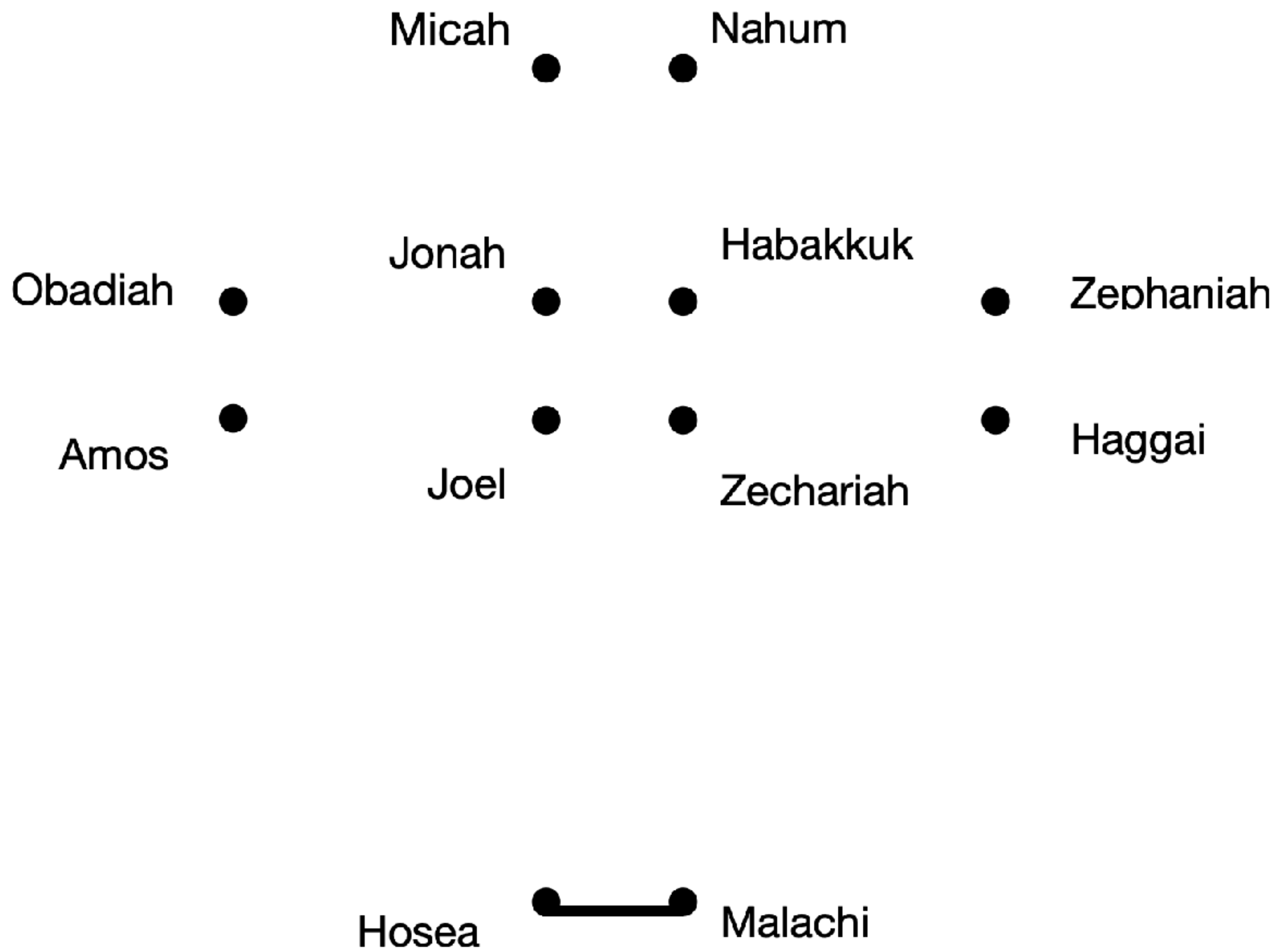
- 18** Woe to you who long

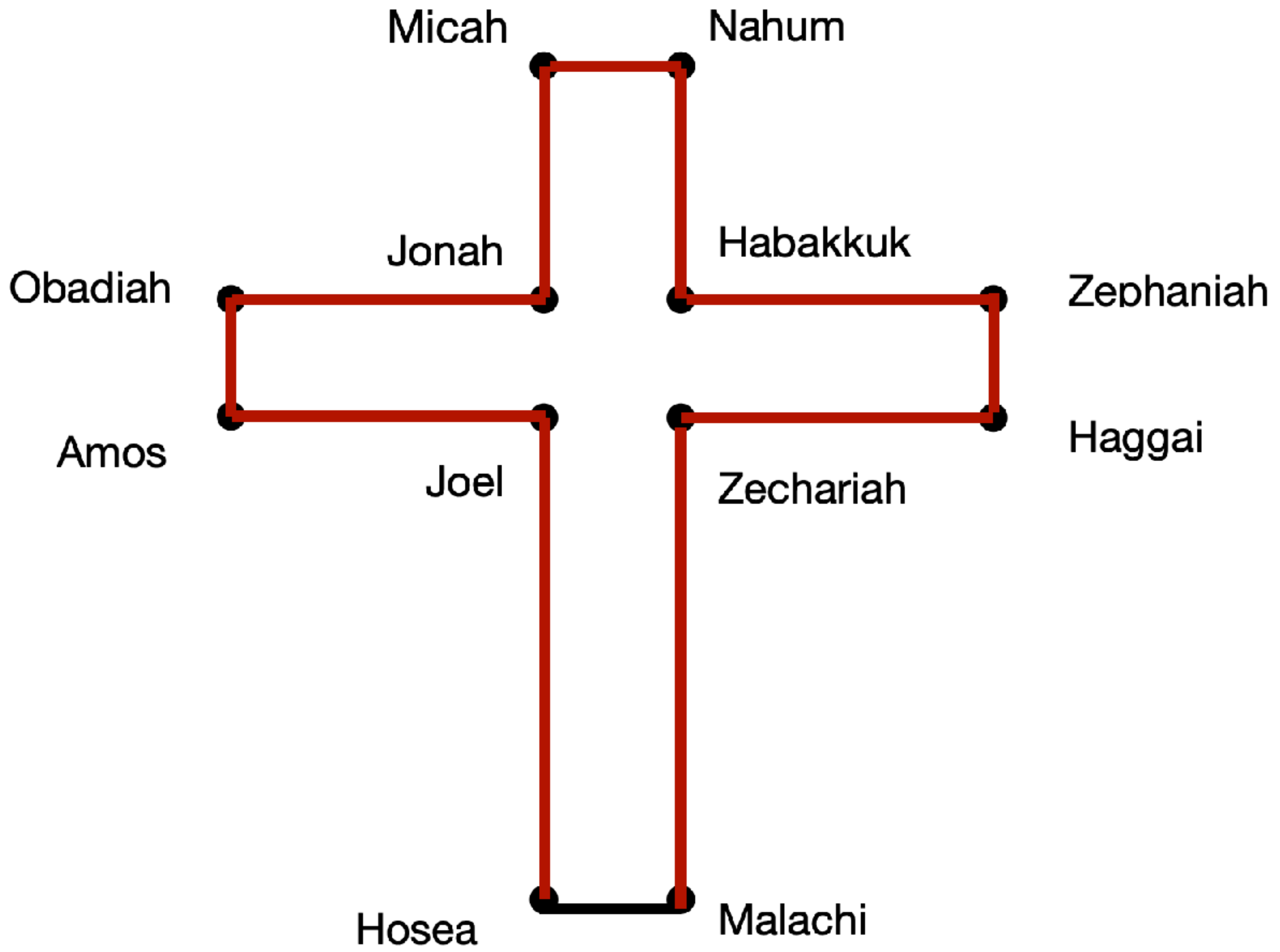
“That terrible day of the LORD is near.

Zephaniah 3:16-17 NLT

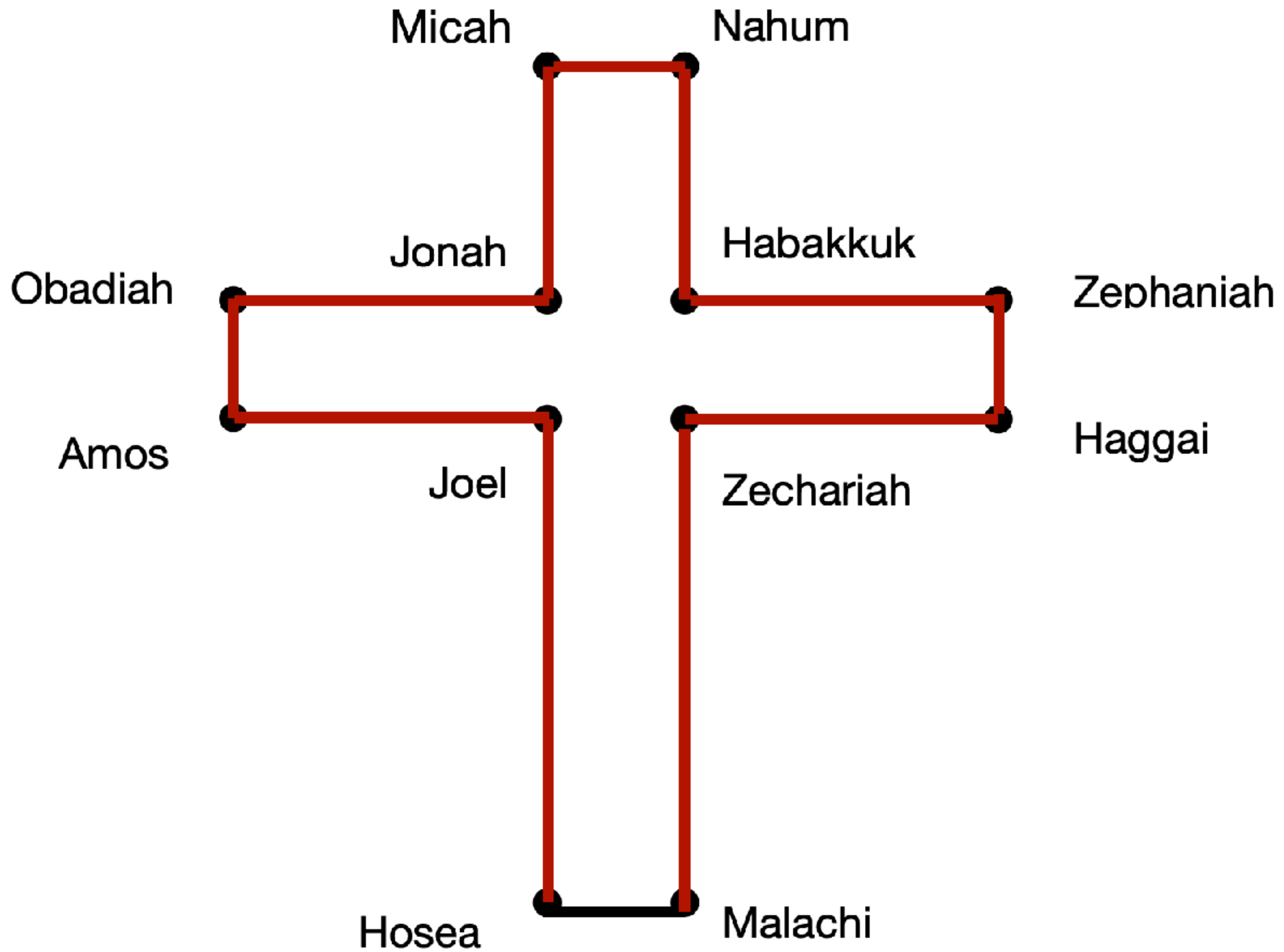
On that day the announcement to Jerusalem will be,
